

Services of the Library

- A. The library will select from the mass of available materials, and organize for easy access, those book or materials which best meet the needs of the community.
- B. The library will keep pace with available technology including audio-visual aids, usage of the Internet and computers, etc. and make these resources available to the public.
- C. The library will initiate programs, exhibits, book lists, etc., to stimulate the use of library materials for the enlightenment of people of all ages.
- D. The library accepts the responsibility for securing information beyond its own resources by borrowing for patrons with serious interests, materials which are not owned by the library and which cannot be purchased, or materials for which the demand does not justify purchase.
- E. The library will lend to other libraries materials which are requested for patrons with serious interests and which are not available in the borrowing library. Patrons of this library have a priority in the use of materials. Materials the library director may judge to be rare or difficult to replace will not be loaned.
- F. The library will endeavor to maintain a balance in its services to men, women, young people and children.
- G. The public library will cooperate with, but cannot perform the functions of school, and other institutional libraries, which are designed to meet curricular needs.
- H. The library will provide the best in children's reading -- both fiction and non-fiction.

- I. Library services will be provided during hours which best meet budgetary and community needs.

- J. Periodic review will be made of library services to determine whether the needs of the community indicate that present services should be discontinued or other services added.
